BELIEF IN MESSENGERS

When the first revelation sent down to the prophet Muhammad (SallAllahu Alaihi Wasallam) in the cave of Hira, he (SallAllahu Alaihi Wasallam) returned with the Inspiration and with his heart beating severely. Then he went to (his beloved wife) Khadija bint Khuwailid (RadhiAllahu Anha) and said," زُمِّلُونِي زُمِّلُونِي زُمِّلُونِي زُمِّلُونِي نَمِّلُونِي نَمِيلًا للسنان الله المعلق ا zammiluni" "Cover me! Cover me!" They covered him till his fear was over and after that he (SallAllahu Alaihi Wasallam) told her everything that had happened and said, "I fear that something may happen to me." Khadija (*RadhiAllahu Anha*) replied, "Never! By Allah, Allah will never disgrace you. You keep good relations with your kith and kin, help the poor and the destitute, serve your guests generously and assist the deserving calamity-afflicted ones." Khadija then accompanied him to her cousin Waraqa bin Naufal bin Asad bin 'Abdul 'Uzza, who, during the pre-Islamic Period became a Christian and used to write the writing with Hebrew letters. He would write from the Gospel in Hebrew as much as Allah wished him to write. He was an old man and had lost his eyesight. Khadija (RadhiAllahu Anha) said to Waraga, "Listen to the story of your nephew, O my cousin!" Waraqa asked, "O my nephew! What have you seen?" Allah's Messenger (SallAllahu Alaihi Wasallam) described whatever he had seen. Waraqa said, "This is the same one who keeps the secrets (angel Gabriel) whom Allah had sent to Moses. (Bukhari)

Belief in angles is the fourth pillar of Iman (Belief), as contained in the hadith known as Hadith-e-Jibraiel". The Prophet (*SallAllahu Alaihi Wasallam*) said when Jibraiel (Alaihis Salam) asked him about Iman:

Translation of Meaning:

'To believe in Allah, His Angels, His, Books, His Messengers, the Day of Judgment, and Al-*Qadar*, the good of it and the bad of it.'

Allah (*Ta'ala*) sent many prophets and messengers for the guidance of mankind. Some of them have been mentioned in the Holy Quran while great majority of

them have not been mentioned in the Holy Quran. However, we have to believe in all on them. Allah (*Ta'ala*) says:

Translation of Meaning: So believe in Allâh and His Messengers. (An-Nisa:171)

At another place Allah (Ta'ala) says:


